

Oregon Worker Relief Fund

Data Snapshot | August 31, 2020



The Quarantine Fund is a rapid community-based system that provides financial support of up to \$1,290 to agricultural workers who have been exposed to COVID-19 at work or at home and who practice self-quarantine.

78%



Oregonian immigrant families served in the first month by the Q Fund ranged in size from single-person households to large families.

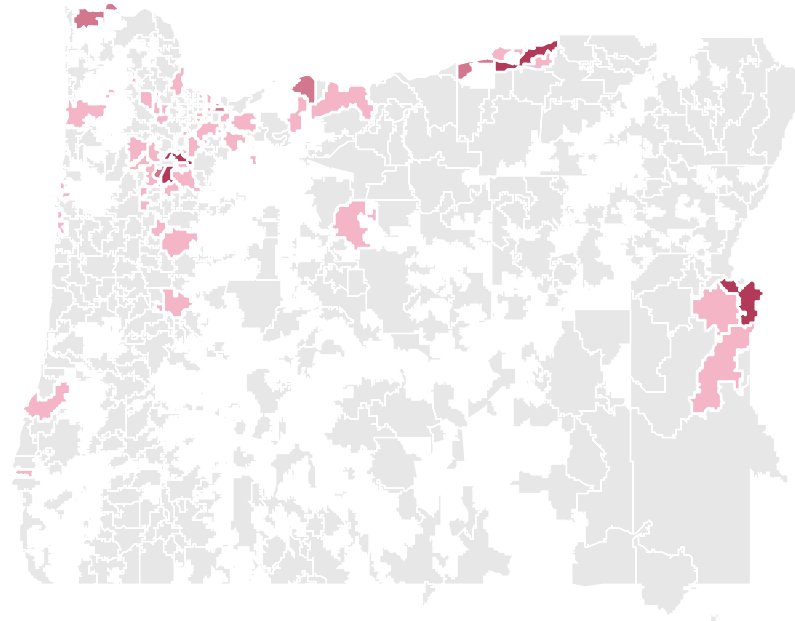
78% supported minor children;

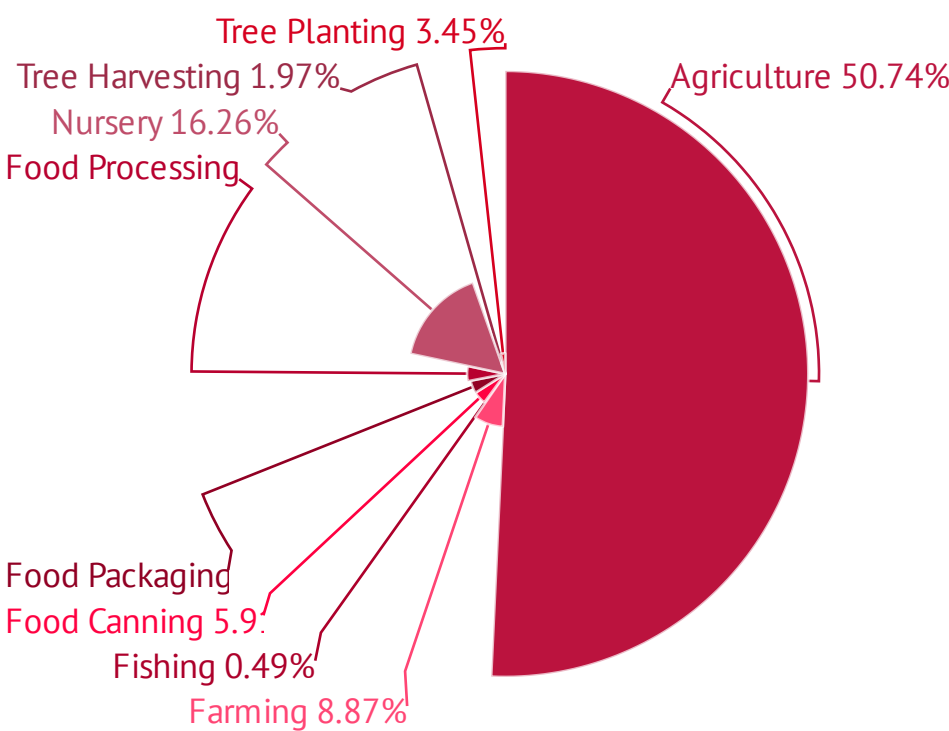

Industry of Fund Recipients



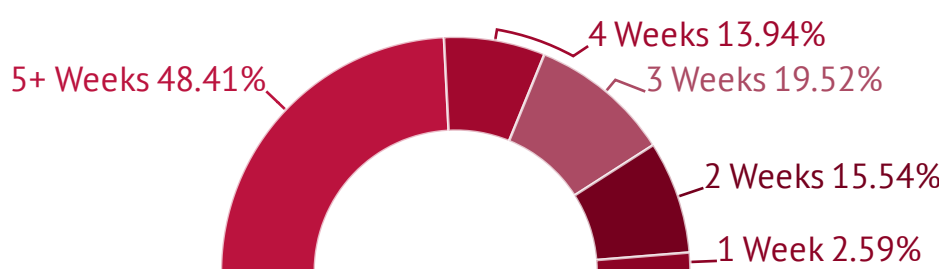

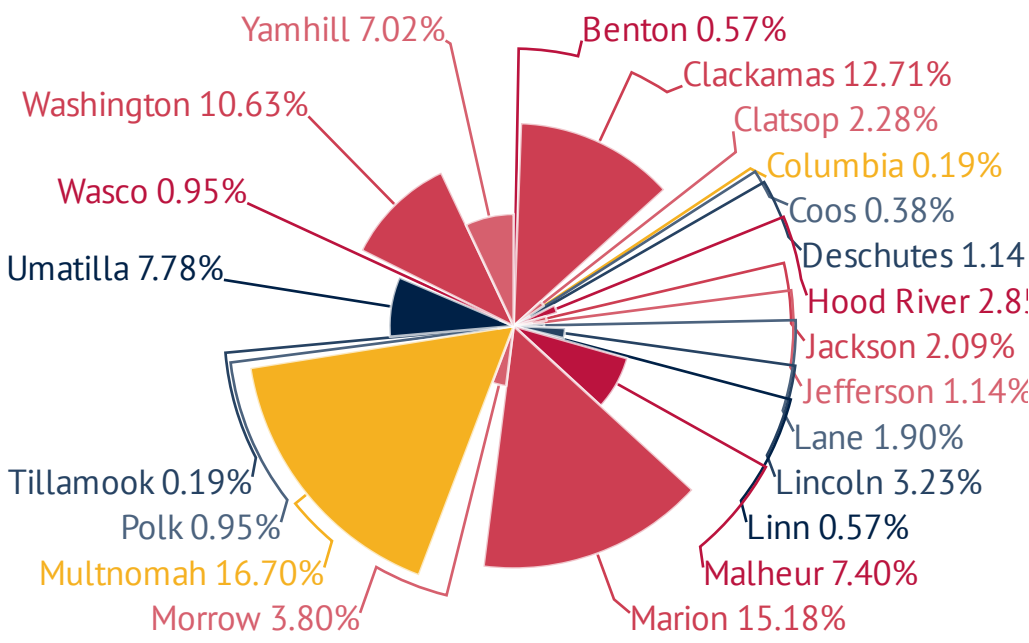

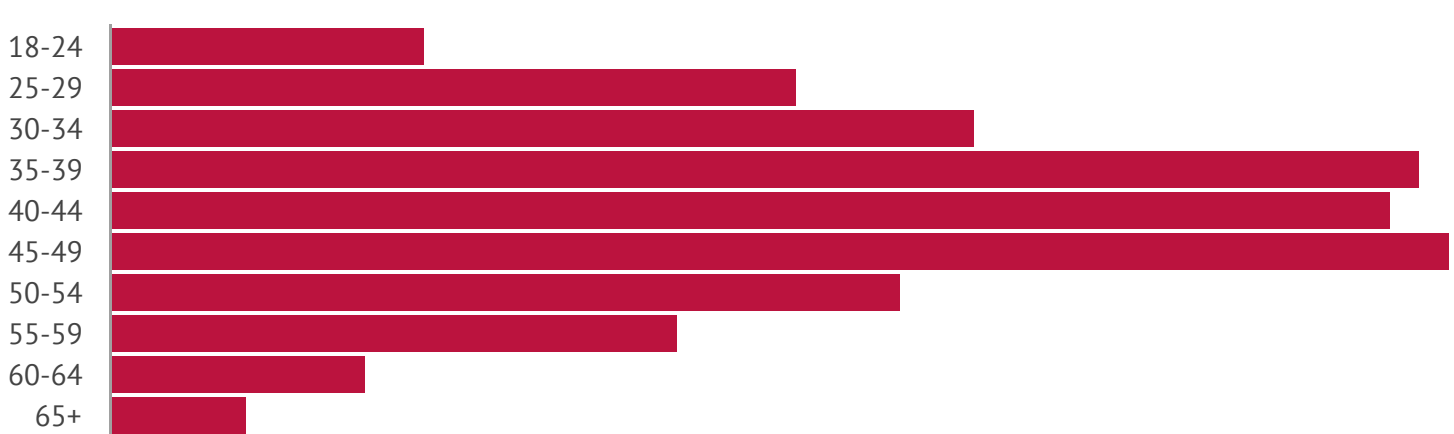
Weeks of Hardship at Time of Application For Relief
