

Oregon Worker Quarantine Fund

Data Snapshot | October 31, 2020



The Quarantine Fund is a rapid community-based system that provides financial support of up to \$1,290 to agricultural workers who have been exposed to COVID-19 at work or at home and who practice self-quarantine.

80%



Oregonian immigrant families served by the Quarantine Fund ranged in size from single-person households to large families.

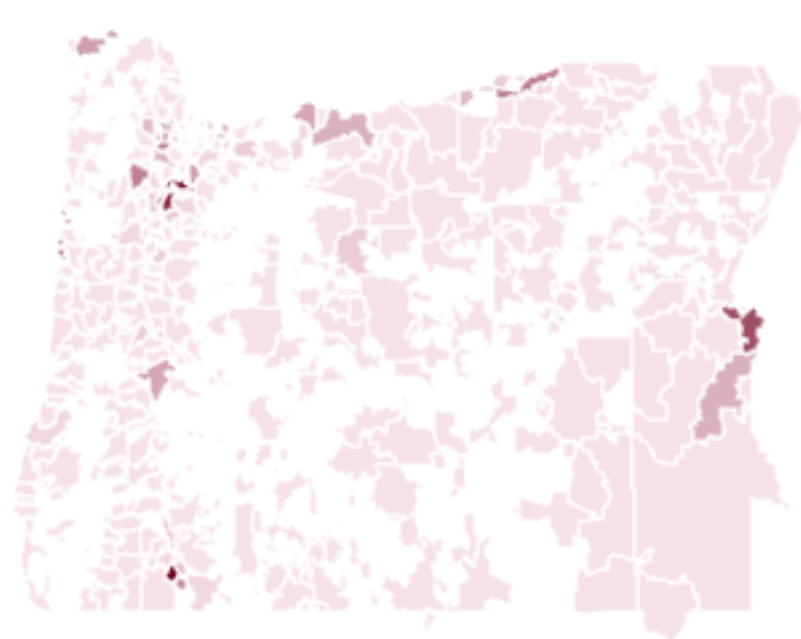
80% had at least 1 dependent minor child.

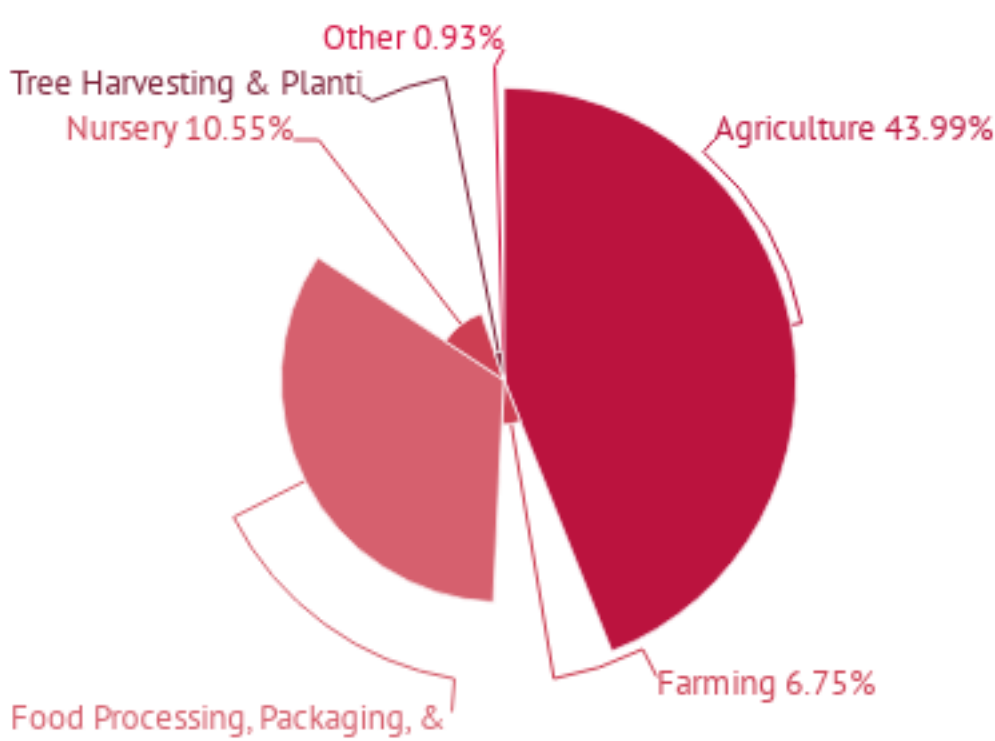

Industry of Fund Recipients



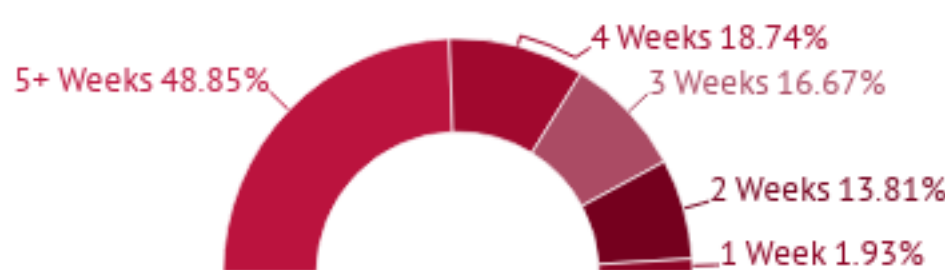
